Participants then picked up the traditional Chinese paper cutting skill right after lunch. After a thorough demonstration by an instructor, volunteers assisted the Hong Chi students to cut different characters or festive holiday patterns deftly. Participants worried that the semi-finished products would be destroyed accidentally, so they concentrated to proceed carefully during the paper-cutting process. All the participants were satisfied with their works and the "Fun Cooking Kitchen" ended in laughter.

Hong Kong Life Chief Marketing Officer Kennex Chan said, "Hong Kong Life hopes to help the intellectually disabled to get along well with others through learning culinary and the traditional Chinese paper cutting skills.
